My will is that my daughter, Martha Mayo [#422/1 ?], now Martha Lad, have one negroe girl Named Jane, and her Increase after the death or Marriage of my wife, to her & her heirs for ever; also one feather bed & furniture to be Raised out of my estate at the discretion of my wife My will is that my daughter Mary Mayo, have one negroe girl nam'd Sarah, and her Increase for ever after the death or Marriage of my wife Also One feather Bed & furniture to be Rais'd out of my estate at the discretion of my wife,

My will is that my Son Benjamin Mayo, One feather Bed & furniture to be Rais'd out of my estate at the discretion of my wife

And my will is that my Son Stephen Mayo have one feather Bed & furniture to be Rais'd out of my estate at the discretion of my wife,

My will is that my two Grandaughters, Martha Williamson Williams, and Mary Ann Williams, One Equal part between them with those hereafter mention'd but if either of them Shou'd die without Lawful heir that the other Shou'd have her part, & if Both Shou'd die without Lawful heir, that then both their parts shall Come into the Division of my estate,

My will is that the Remaining part of my estate both Real & Personal, which may or Shall be at my wife's decease or marriage, be Equally divided between my Sons, Valentive Mayo, James Mayo, John Mayo, Robert Mayo Jacob Mayo, Williamson Mayo, Joseph Mayo, Thomas Mayo, Richard George Mayo, Benjamin Mayo, Stephen Mayo, to them & their heirs for Ever; but if either of my Children Shoud die, without Lawful heir, that their part or parts, so dieing, be Equally divided Amongst the Survivors"

Your orator further states to your worships that, in consequence of the contract aforesaid, he did actually deliver into the possession of the deft. five head of cattle, viz, two cows and their calves and a young heifer which your orator has been informed have increased to a very considerable number, but now . . . the deft., altho called upon for that purpose in a friendly manner, refuses to account to your orator for any part of the cattle afs’d or their increase, pretending that they are all dead at some times, and at other times denying the contract as stated between him and your orator. “To the Worshipful Court of Fluvanna in Chancery sitting
The answer of William Bradshaw [#42] to a Bill of Complaint exhibited in Chancery against him by Joseph Lambert, complainant.

The defendant . . . answerith & saith that true it is that he took five of the complainant’s cattle upon half stocks, according to the agreement as stated in the complainant’s bill, but shortly after this respondent received the s’d cattle, three of number died. This respondent tann’d the hides and delivered the leather to the complainant and, upon finding that the increase was then so small it was agreed between the complainant and this respondent that the stock then remaining on hand should be sold, and the complainant set his price on them, and this respondent sold the s’d stock, agreeable s’d price and paid to the complainant the total amount, according to their last agreement. This respondent expressly denies that the cattle ever increased to a considerable number or that he denied to settle & account with the complainant for the s’d stock or their increase. But, on the contrary, expressly charges that he has in all things complied with his s’d last mentioned agreement with the complainant by selling the remaining stock and paying the money arising from s’d sale to the complainant, according to s’d agreement.

This respondent denies all fraud and prays to be hence dismissed with his costs, etc.




