

Hutchison, Geo. Head [#12155], then to the ford on Miller’s Creek at Turner’s, then with the Springfield Road to the ford on Caleb’s Creek, then up the creek to where Elijah Barnett lived, then to the beginning.”



Joel Ragsdale Coroner returned into Court an inquest into over the body of William Head Dec'd. It is therefore ordered that he be allowed agreeable to law, also that James Yates be allowed five dollars for burying said Head, also Abraham Pope be allowed five dollars for a coffin for s'd dec'd. All to be paid by the County Trustee out of any money in his hands not otherwise appropriated.

“Ordered that Isaac Carter oversee the road from Fluellen’s old place to the fork near Turnersville in the room of Henry Ayres, and that he, with . . . John Head [#12158] . . . keep the same in repair, agreeable to law.”

“I, E. B. Head [#1527C/1], being of sound mind and disposing memory do make and ordain this as my last will and testament, hereby revoking all other wills by me at any time made.

First I direct that all my just debts shall be paid out of the first monies that may come into the hands of my executor.

Second I will and bequeath to my grandsons, Graham [#1527C31] and Charles Head [#1527C32], the children of my deceased son Lee Head [#1527C3] one half of all my estate to their sole and separate use, and if I should die before they become of age, I hereby nominate and appoint Mr. Thos. H. King to manage and invest what I herein have given them for them and if he should refuse to qualify and act, then I direct that the County Court shall appoint some one to manage it for them, who is not connected with the Gillespie family. Should Charles, Graham die without having children, then I direct that what I have given them herein shall descend and go to my heirs at law.

Third I direct that the remaining half of my property be divided equally between Mrs. Etta Miller [#1527C1], John Head [#1527C5] my son, Ada C. Peay [#1527C21] and Etta [#1527C44], Evie [#1527C42], and Willie Weisiger [#1527C45] the children of Joseph Weisiger Jr. [#1527C4/1] Mrs. Miller to have one fourth, Jno. Head to have one fourth, Mrs. Peay to have one fourth and the Weisiger children to have on fourth.

Fourth What I have given to Mrs. Miller herein I give to her sole and separate use free from the control, debts or contracts of any future husband she may have.

Fifth I direct that what I have given the Weisiger children herein shall be to their own use, and shall be managed for them by some one appointed by the County Court not connected with the Weisiger family and should they all die without leaving children then what I have given them herein to descend to and go to my heirs at law. What I have given Etta and Evie Weisiger herein I give and bequeath to them free from the contracts, control or debts of any husbands they may have.

Sixth What I have given to Mrs. Ada Peay herein I give to her sole and separate use free from the control contracts or debts of her present or any future husband. My son Lee Head at his death was indebted to Mrs. Ada Peay in the sum of one thousand dollars now if this is not paid her out of his estate at my death, I want it paid out of what I have given his children Charles and Graham herein, but without interest.

Seventh I give to my daughter Mrs. Etta Miller my room furniture.

Eighth I give my bed clothing to Mrs. Ada Peay.

Ninth I give my large Bible to Etta Weisiger.

Tenth I give my breast pin to Evie Weisiger.

Eleventh I direct that my silver forks be divided equally one half to my daughter Mrs. Etta Miller and one half to Evie and Etta Weisiger.

Twelfth Should any one of my devisees make or cause any trouble about the disposition I have made of my property herein or set up any claim to any of my estate other than as is given them in this my will, I direct that they shall forfeit all claims to any of my estate and what I have given them herein shall descend to or go to my other heirs at law subject to the same conditions as the legacies herein given them. This 7th day of Feb. 1894. I nominate and appoint T. H. King as Executor of this my will.

Second Upon mature reflection and in consideration of my having given to my son the sum of \$1000.00 the last time he went to California and the further consideration that he has a plenty, I desire to alter & change clause "Third" of my above will in as to leave the portion of my estate therein devised to Mrs. Etta Miller, Jno W. “I, John Head [#152773], being of sound mind and memory, do hereby make and publish this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all other wills heretofore made by me.

Item 1 I direct my executor hereinafter appointed to pay all of my just debts, including the burial expenses as soon as possible after my death.

Item 2nd My sister Penelope F. Head [#152776], and my sister Miss S. E. Head [#15277B], who have always lived with me, and kept house for me, and looked after me and who expect to remain with me until my death, I desire to be cared for and supported out of my property as long as they live for their kindness and attention to me in my affliction, and with this purpose in view, I hereby give and bequeath to these two sisters, all of my personal and real estate, to have, to hold and to use, during their natural life, and at the death of the survivor of said two sisters, I direct that all of my said estate, be divided equally among my nephews and nieces, share and share alike without reference to the interests of their fathers or mothers, if I had died without a will.

Item 3rd I hereby appoint David Chenault Sr. [#152762/1] my executor without bond or security, and give him full power and authority to sell all my personal estate and real estate, and re-invest the same, if necessary, either before or after the death of my said two sisters, and he



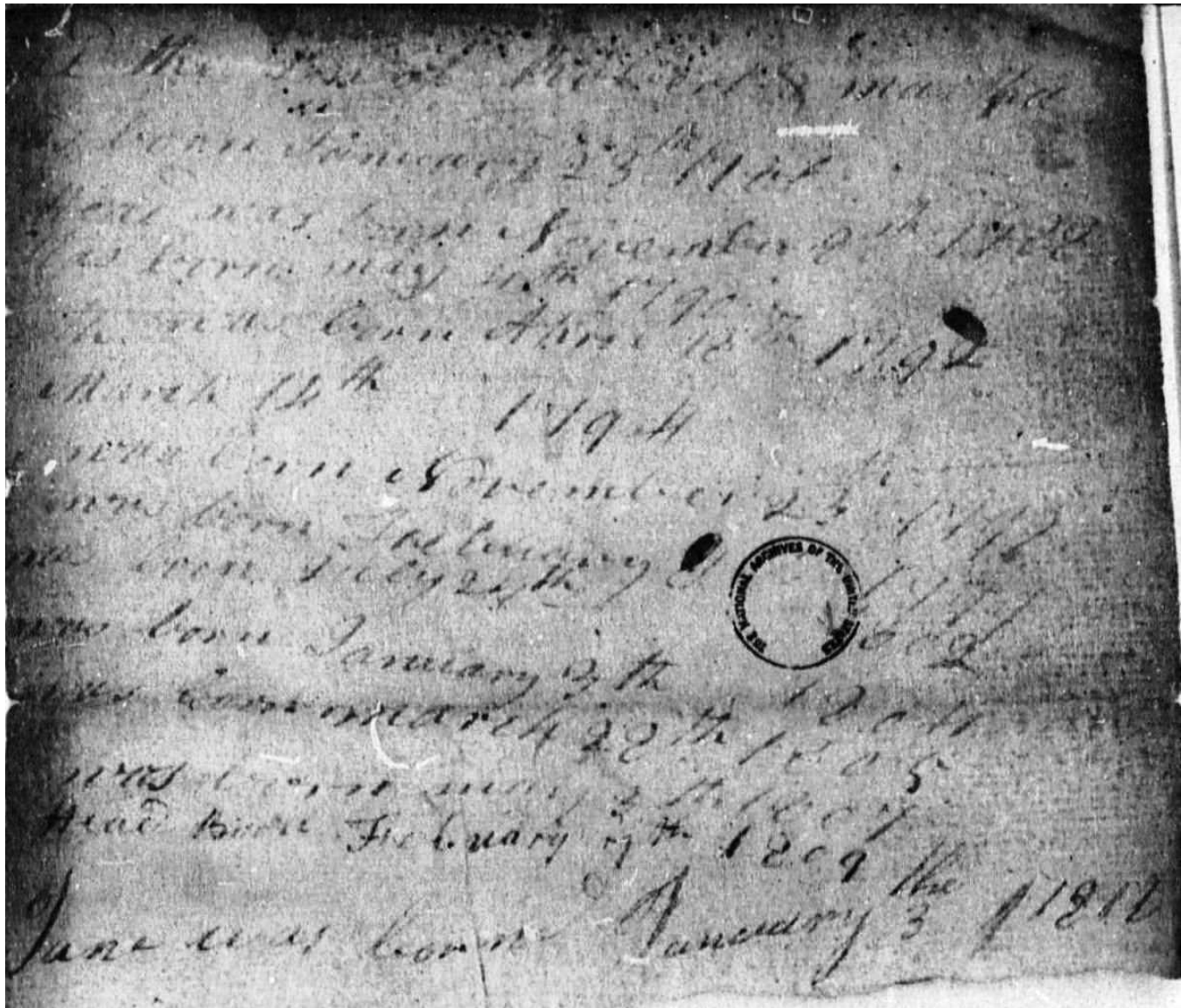

"State of Tennessee, Robertson County } May Term 1835

Robert Head [#1215] personally appeared before the County Court of Robertson this [12 May 1835] now in session for said County, for the purpose of making a declaration in order to obtain the benefit of an Act of Congress passed [7 Jun 1832] for the benefit of the soldiers of the Revolutionary War & being duly sworn upon his oath declares that he entered the service of the United States as a volunteer in a Company commanded by Capt. Spears in the County of Surrey in the State of North Carolina for a tour of duty of three months & marched to Salisbury & joined the Army of Gen'l Rutherford at Salisbury & marched with them to join the Army of Gen'l Gates, which they did before Gates' defeat [Battle of Camden, 16 Aug 1780] near the Hanging Rock in South Carolina & during the battle he & his Company were with the baggage waggons & not in the action. The troops were then dispersed & the Army was not again collected until after his term of service expired. He thinks the campaign was in the year 1778 or 1779, but cannot recollect nor can he now recollect to what Regiment his Company was attached when he joined Rutherford at Salisbury. He saw Rutherford at Salisbury & that Rutherford was wounded in the battle, had his thigh broken, was taken prisoner. That he again entered the service of the U. S. as a volunteer on [8 Nov 1780] in Surrey County in a Company comanded by Capt. Benj. Humphreys & in a Regiment commanded by

Col. Joseph Philips & James Shepherd was Major & that he was marched to Salisbury to guard the British prisoners & that he continued in the service until [6 Jan] when he learned that his father [#121] had died & that his mother [#121/1] was sick & likely to die & he employed & paid for a substitute for the balance of his tour & received from his Captain a discharge which accompanies this declaration with the signature of "C. Johnson" on it to identify the papers. That some time after this, Gen'l Green ordered Capt. Minor Smith to raise a Company of volunteers to act as Rangers & that he entered the service as a volunteer for six months under Capt. Smith & James Blackwell was Lieutenant. That he acted as such during the six months for which he enlisted & also one month in addition before he was finally discharged. He says that whilst he was acting in this service, the Legislature which sat at Hillsborough was broke up by the Tories headed by Col. Fannen [Col. David Fanning, 12 Sep 1781] & the Legislature then went to Salem & the Company of Rangers was employed in scouring the country & protecting & guarding the citizens from the depredations of the British & Tories, having served in all thirteen months. That he rec'd discharges for each tour of service & thought that all of them had been long since destroyed until accidentally he came across the one accompanying this declaration. That he has not seen the other discharges for many years. That he knows of no witnesses by whom his services can be proven & no other written evidence. That he has now no record of his age, but had many years in his possession a Bible containing a record of the ages of his father's family kept by him which was burnt some years since. He frequently saw his own age & he was [77] years old [30 Nov] last. That he was born in Orange County, Virginia & removed to Surrey County where he lived during the Revolutionary War. After the war, he went to South Carolina & he moved frequently to different parts of North & South Carolina & finally settled himself in Robertson County, Tennessee, where he has resided the last [19] years & still resides. He hereby relinquishes all claims to the U. States for any services except the benefits provided by the Act of [Jun 1832] & that he is on no pension roll whatever & refers for his character to John S. Hutchison & John Lamaster.

This [2 Jan 1854] personally appeared in open Court of said County, which is a Court of Record, George Head [#12155], aged 59, a resident of Robertson County, Tennessee and who is hereby certified to be a credible person, and made the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provisions of the Acts of Congress of [7 Jun 1832], [7 Jul 1838], [3 Mar 1843], [17 Jun 1844], & [2 Feb 1848]. That he is the son & Administrator of Robert Head [#1215], deceased, and Martha Head [#1215/1], dec'd, both late of said County. That the said Robert Head served in the Revolutionary War as a Private for about [12] months in the Militia, he thinks, of Surrey County, North Carolina, and for the particulars of his service refers to his father's papers now on file with his claim to pension under Act of [7 Jun 1832]. The said Robert Head and Martha Head were married in Surrey County, North Carolina sometime in the year 1785, as the oldest child was born in 1786, as appears from the annexed record of the births of their children as rept. by declarant's father in his life time. That her name before her marriage was Martha Elder. That the said Robert Head died in the said Robertson County, Tennessee on [25 Dec 1838] and left the said Martha surviving him. She remained his widow till she died, which occurred in said County on [20 Feb 1852]. She left the following named and only surviving children, to wit, Frances Head [#12152], George Head [#12155], Hiram Head [#12157], Hugh Head [#1215A], Sarah Ells [#1215B], and Martha Winters [#1215C], who are the only surviving children of the said Robert and Martha Head,

dec'd. He requests that the pension be payable to him as Administrator for the benefit of said children. . . .

This [2 Jan 1854] personally appeared in open Court, James Darden and John S. Hutchison, who attest the foregoing declaration of George Head and make oath in due form of law to the following facts . . . That they both personally knew Robert Head, dec'd, late of said County, and Martha Head, his wife. That they lived together for many years and, since the first acquaintance of affiants with them, as man and wife and were so regarded and reputed as as such raised up a family of children. That the said Robert Head was generally regarded as and believed to have been a Revolutionary soldier from the State of North Carolina, and that he died in said County on Christmas day in the year 1838, and that the said Martha survived him and continued his widow to the day of her death, which occurred in said County in [Feb 1852] and that Frances Head, George Head, Hiram Head, John Head, Hugh Head, Sarah Ellis, and Martha Winters are the only surviving children of the said Robert and Martha Head, and that George Head, who has this day signed the foregoing declaration in their presence, is the son & Administrator of them. They further state that William Head, their oldest child, if now living, would be at least 65 or 70 years of age.
